Storage Unit with conditioned air are being looked into. With the storage of books and shirts we need a climatized unit. Prices are higher. We are shopping around.

We have approximately 150 to 200 Books left. We will sell at the front desk with the shirts and hats.

Cal announced that the Ducks unlimited National convention will be held in New Orleans, La. this year on July 13, 14, and 15.

The State Convention will be held in June for 3 days. In Lafayette, La. Cal said that he will bring the water tanks for the show on Friday morning.

Emile said he will pick up drinks and bottle water.

Joan said that she would be at the Castine Center at 2:00 P.M. Friday and that she would take people 3 or 4 p.m. Vendors can come for 2:00 p.m.

Kids who come through the door and enter the show will receive a hat. Meal tickets will be available for Carving and artists judges; as well as workers.

The live bird show will be on Saturday at 2:00 p.m.

Dickey is collecting dues tonight.
